A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF FAIRFIELD, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICE PROVIDER CONTRACT FOR THE 2021-2022 TEXAS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FUND.



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF FAIRFIELD, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING THE CREATION OF A RESERVE PROGRAM FOR THE FAIRFIELD POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, Section 341.012 of the Texas Local Government Code allows a governing body of the municipality to provide for the establishment of a police reserve force; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Fairfield, Texas shall establish qualifications and standards of training for members of the reserve force; and

WHEREAS, reserve police officers and dispatchers may only act in a supplementary capacity to regular police officers and dispatchers; and

WHEREAS, the Fairfield Police Department has advised the City Council on standards for reserve officers, including requirements set forth by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Standards and Education; and

WHEREAS, the selection process for reserve officers and dispatchers is the same as regular officers and dispatchers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. The City Council consents to the creation of the Fairfield Police Department Reserve Program.

SECTION 2. The City Council hereby determines that the qualifications for a Reserve officer or dispatcher will be the qualifications set in Exhibit A, Police Reserve Program Qualifications (FPD-M).

I. POLICY

It is the policy of the Fairfield Police Department to maintain the highest standards of professional law enforcement services. Volunteers for reserve police officers/dispatchers must meet the same standards as other members of the organization. Reserve police officers/dispatchers should fulfill two primary functions. First, reserve officers/dispatchers serve as auxiliary manpower in situations as needed. Second, they provide an additional interactive link between the community and the police department. Reserve officers/dispatchers are subject to all the applicable rules and regulations that govern regular sworn personnel.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to describe the Fairfield Police Departments, Reserve Unit, and outline its objectives, responsibilities, and operation.

III.RESERVE PROGRAM

A. Requirements and certification

- 1. Requirements for age, education, and experience are the same as that for regular sworn personnel.
- 2. Applicants must meet all minimum requirements set forth by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCOLE).
- 3. The selection process for reserve officer/dispatcher applicants is the same as for regular officers.

B. Certification and reserve officer levels

1. Apprentice Reserve personnel. Active reserve police/dispatch personnel who have obtained required peace officer/dispatcher training but have not completed field training.

- 2. Reserve Personnel. Active reserve personnel who have successfully completed basic peace officer certification, have completed field training, and hold basic peace office/dispatch license.
 - a. Reserve personnel will be assigned their duties on the reserve schedule by the reserve supervisor.
 - b. Reserve personnel shall report to the supervisor or ranking officer for assignment duties and/or training.
 - c. The on-duty patrol supervisor may, at his/her discretion, reassign the personnel when personnel are required to assist in other areas.
- 3. "Inactive reserve status" refers to reserve police officers/dispatchers who are temporarily unable to serve at the minimum required level. Inactive status may not extend beyond 60 days unless approved by the Chief of Police.

C. Training and Performance Standards

- 1. Reserve personnel serve at the discretion of the Chief of Police and may be called into service at any time the chief or his designee considers it necessary to have additional personnel.
- 2. Reserve personnel shall be considered "on duty" when they are
 - a. performing "assigned duty"
 - b. representing or identifying himself/herself as a peace officer/dispatcher for the purpose of taking enforcement action or discharging legal duties.
- 3. All reserve police officers/dispatcher must serve a minimum of 16 hours of duty per calendar month. Officers/dispatchers who are unable to meet this requirement must submit a written request through the chain of command to the Chief of Police for an approved leave of absence.
- 4. Depending on the level of training and experience, reserve personnel may perform the same duties as other full-time, sworn personnel or be assigned to work with a regular officer/dispatcher.
- 5. All reserve personnel are subject to the same rules, regulations, and orders as regular sworn personnel.
- 6. All reserve police officers/dispatchers must at minimum successfully complete the basic courses required by TCOLE and obtains their license as a peace officer/dispatcher.
- 7. All reserve personnel will be required to attend periodic department inservice training to complete the following:
 - a. The same training as required of regular sworn officers including courses mandated by TCOLE for certification requirements;
 - b. All departmentally required qualifications on firearms, less lethal tools, and any other equipment deemed necessary.

D. Chain-of-Command and Operations

- 1. The reserve unit functions as a unit of patrol/dispatch and reports to the on duty supervisor.
- 2. The reserve coordinator is appointed by the Chief of Police and shall be responsible for the overall administration and planning of the reserve unit.

E. Organizational Function

- 1. The primary function of reserve police officers/dispatchers will be to supplement patrol/dispatch operations personnel.
- 2. Additionally, reserve officers/dispatchers will be on call for assistance in emergency situations such as disasters, riots, etc., and to provide additional manpower for special enforcement assignments.
- 3. All reserve personnel assignments will be coordinated through the on duty patrol supervisor.
- 4. Reserve officers/dispatchers may, at the discretion of the Chief of Police, be assigned to other functions within the department depending on the skills and experience of each individual.



Thank you for meeting with me today. First and foremost, I would like to thank the City of Fairfield, the City Council, Mayor, and yourself for all the support the City of Fairfield has provided for Fairfield EMS.

As discussed, I have attached the requested information for you and the Council.

Number one on our list are ventilators. We have seen an increase in patient use and need for ventilators/CPAP/BiPAP this year more than past years. The one ventilator we currently use, has a unique capability of a full functioning ventilator as well as Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP), and Bilevel Positive Airway Pressure (BiPAP). These capabilities are not only beneficial to COVID related patients but are very useful in many respiratory emergencies we may respond to. We currently only have one of these ventilators and would like to add two more to our other units. The ability to have multiple ventilators would provide better coverage for our patients and community to have available if and when needed.

Second, on our list of needs will be three (3) UV disinfection units to assist us in the disinfection process of the ambulances. This process would add to our current disinfection process, to help protect the public and our employees.

Dear Sir:

On October 15, 2020, we engaged in a conversation about the purchase of ventilators being reimbursed by the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF).

I explained that after meeting with Fairfield EMS Director Ignacio "Billy" Perez, the ventilators needed have Cpap, Bipap, and conventional ventilation capabilities. Perez informed me that the Fairfield EMS has only one ventilator with this capability, and that the ambulance service has transported patients suspected of, or confirmed as, COVID-19 cases. Several of those cases needed bipap breathing support.

Perez explained to me that if he has to send a patient needing that one ventilator with bipap capability to another hospital, the bipap capability cannot be performed on other suspected COVID-19 cases.

The purchase of two additional ventilators is neither budgeted by the city, nor Fairfield EMS, a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that is supported, in part, by the city to provide ambulance service inside the city limits of Fairfield.

Therefore, I believe the purchase of these ventilators is essential for the life and safety of residents inside the City of Fairfield.
